Agenda Item: Superintendent's Report **Presenter:** Ketler Louissaint, Superintendent, D75

Superintendent Louissaint was unable to attend the meeting Dr. Beverly Ffolkes-Bryant, District 75 Liaison attended on his behalf. She informed the council of the following:

- Dr. Bryant is the D75 Liaison for the Bronx and Brooklyn.
- D75 parent coordinators throughout the five boroughs have planned Family Events for families to attend.
- Family Events last all day at school sites and focuses on fun and a learning experience for families. This year there was a high rate of attendance: 480 attendees in the Bronx, 475 attendees in Brooklyn and 491 attendees in Manhattan. Queens is scheduled to have their event this weekend and hope they can past last year number of 791 attendees.
- D75 will host the New Teachers Symposium. Newly hired teaches to D75 is a hard job and the district wants to celebrate the first ten months of adjusting as well as remaining with the school community. The symposium is hosted throughout the five boroughs, support is provided to the teachers. Next week will be the Teachers Tenure Celebration. Once the teachers are hired it takes teachers five years and completion of probation the D75 has a celebration at the UFT building at 52 Broadway.
- Dr. Bryant organized the D75 Arts Festival that is held the first week in May. She mentioned previously she opened a school for the arts. Out of the 61 schools the district had 58 schools that had an exhibition. The exhibition was held at NYC Technical College we had 23 students perform as well.
- Samuel Stern Awards: Samuel Stern was an educator who died in the 1920's and left his trust fund for District 75. Every year the District honors twelve students know for their academic achievement and service to the community, character, commitment, and determination.
- District 75 Poetry Slam: high school students across the district shared their written word. There is a book available and CEC members should call Sacha to receive one.
- The District Partnered with the CEI Program: If you recall the artwork of cows that were on display around NYC. The new project are benches and District 75 has a bench that is near Washington Square Park and it is a collaboration of D75 H.S. students.
- In June is our Annual Stem Fair on June 18th where students throughout the District participate in the student's exhibition and it will be held on the Intrepid.
